BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD

TONNAGE GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE YEAR 2015 RESOLUTION #32 - 2016

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c. 102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the 2015 Recycling Tonnage Grant will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Borough of East Rutherford to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of East Rutherford that the Borough of East Rutherford hereby endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates a certified employee of the Bergen County Utilities Authority, pursuant to shared services contract, to ensure that the application is properly filed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the monies from the recycling tonnage grant be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be used solely for the purposes of recycling.

WHEREAS, regionalized providing of such services is a concept specifically endorsed by the aforementioned statutory scheme; and

WHEREAS, both of the parties to such an Agreement are authorized by law to enter into an agreement with one another to provide jointly for any lawful service to and for the residents of the respective municipalities pursuant to the provisions of the "Interlocal Services Act" N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Bodies of the Borough of East Rutherford and the Borough of Paramus recognize that the implementation of an Interlocal Agreement to provide "PSAP" service, on a regionalize, cost sharing basis is still in the best interest of the taxpayers of the respective municipalities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and Council hereby authorizes the execution of a "PSAP" Interlocal Services Agreement with the Borough of Paramus for one year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the cost of same shall be in the amount of \$4,584.50 for calendar year 2016.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford hereby authorizes the execution of the attached Agreement with the Borough of Paramus.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the agreement shall take effect upon the execution of the agreement and adoption of Resolutions by both parties as provided by law.

PERMITTING OPERATION OF AMUSEMENT GAMES ON THE GROUNDS

OF THE NEW JERSEY SPORTS & EXPOSITION AUTHORITY COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE MEADOWLANDS

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (hereinafter the Meadowlands) is located in the Borough of East Rutherford, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, State Fair Amusement Corporation (hereinafter State Fair) has been granted written permission, subject to "Licenses from East Rutherford," to operate certain amusement games on the grounds of the Meadowlands; and

WHEREAS, the location of the amusement games to be operated by State Fair is on the premises of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, East Rutherford, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, under N.J.S.A. 5:8-103 and other related Rules and Regulations, the issuance of licenses for amusement games must be authorized by a resolution duly adopted by the Municipal Governing Body of the municipality in which the games are to be located; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Consumer Affairs, Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission, has confirmed that the Borough of East Rutherford is authorized to issue such licenses and the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority has authorized the operation of games of skill with attendants and prizes to operate at various dates during the year 2016;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford as follows:

1. That the Borough Council of East Rutherford hereby approved State Fair Amusement Corporation to operate amusement games on the premises of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, East Rutherford, New Jersey at various times during the year 2016.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said approval is subject to the specific approval of each game by the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission, Division of Consumer Affairs, Department of Law and Public Safety and any other County and rules and regulations that pertain thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the fee to be charged for each individual license to be issued will be one hundred twenty five (\$125) dollars per game, per event and that the period of time for issuance of said license shall be January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (hereinafter the Meadowlands) is located in the Borough of East Rutherford, New Jersey;

WHEREAS, the following vendors listed in Exhibit A (attached hereto and made a part hereof), will be operating amusement games on the grounds of the Meadowlands; and

WHEREAS, the list is as complete as it can be at this time and any additional vendors who sign on after the date of this resolution must be submitted to the Municipality to be confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the Mayor and Council even if said meeting is subsequent to the commencement of the event; and

WHEREAS, the location of the amusement games to be operated by said vendors listed on Exhibit A (attached hereto and made a part hereof) is located on Route 3 in East Rutherford, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, amusement games are being held pursuant to all the applicable rules and regulations of the Department of Law and Public Safety, Office of Amusement Games Control; and

WHEREAS, under the requirements of the Department of Law and Public Safety, all owners of these games must have undergone a police criminal history background check to which the operators of the State Fair Meadowlands have taken complete responsibility, and shall submit the background check to the appropriate state agencies and to the Municipality upon receipt of the same; and

WHEREAS, under said regulation the issuance of licenses for amusement games must be authorized by a resolution duly adopted by the Municipal Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, the State Office of Amusement Games Control requires the Governing Body of the Borough of East Rutherford to authorize the issuance of such licenses at an approved site;

NOW, THEREFORE be it resolved by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford as follows:

- 1. That the Borough Council of the Borough of East Rutherford hereby approve the vendors listed on Exhibit A (attached hereto and made a part hereof), to operate amusement games on the premises of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, Route 3 in East Rutherford, New Jersey by State Fair Event Management.
- 2. That said approval is subject to the specific approval of each amusement game by the New Jersey Office of Amusement Games Control, and compliance with all State, County and all local regulations pertaining hereto.
- 3. That the fee to be charged for each individual license to be issued will be one hundred twenty five (\$125.00) dollars per game, per event, and that the period of time for the issuance of said license shall be January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016 in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Amusement Games Control Commission.

WHEREAS, this Plan will provide a uniform procedure for the coordination of the requesting, dispatching and utilization of law enforcement personal and equipment whenever a local law enforcement agency requires mutual aid assistance from any other jurisdiction, both contiguous and non-contiguous, in the event of an emergency, riot or disorder in order to protect life and property; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford to participate in a Mutual Aid Plan and Rapid Deployment Force in accordance with the plan submitted by the Bergen County Police Chief's Association.

Mr. Allen advices that Goldman Sachs is not a financial advisor for the borough.

- 3. Allow the release of items 1 and 2 above upon review and advice of the Borough's Special Transaction Counsel.

Councilman Lahullier, further reiterated that the disclosure letter submitted to the Borough is essentially an acknowledgement, and the borough will not be issuing bonds at this time.

FIRE DEPT./SQUAD – COUNCILMAN LAHULLIER

Councilman Lahullier stated his interest with Excel Air to install a central air system at the Borough Hall. He stated that the change will further improve the heating system in the building. The company will essentially charge \$2,800.00 to pressurize the lines to ensure the integrity of the coil and freon.

In terms of repaving the curbs and sidewalks on Carlton Avenue, a meeting with the County is scheduled this Friday [1/22/16] to discuss compensating the Borough for work to be done on county roads.

There seem to be slight process as it pertains to Rails to Trails. Northfolk Southern requested documents in Word format, possibly to change or modify the contract terms.

Councilman Lahullier moved to approve a \$2,000 requisition for the VFW which is a stipend for park maintenance.

Councilman Lahullier further mentioned that the Borough's Zoning Map needs updating. He states that the current map is dated back to 1997. The Borough Clerk, Danielle Lorenc, mentioned the error on the map. The Borough's attorney, Richard Allen, responded that the error was corrected. Mayor Cassella concurs that the current map is difficult to read.

Councilman Lahullier mentioned that the Meadowlands Hospital, EMS Service, in Secaucus submitted a proposal to stage an ambulance in town. The EMS service will bill the health insurance company of each patient. The patients are allowed to be transported to whichever hospital of their choice. A stipend would be required, if the ambulance is staged in town.

Councilman Lahullier further mentioned that the borough has a line item in the budget under statutory expenditures, which set aside \$2,400.00 to the widow of Charles Swift on a yearly basis. Councilman Lahullier is requesting the council to divert the funds to a public trust account, giving access to the Borough's residence in need of financial assistance. Councilman Lahullier plans to look into the procedures other towns have on file.

Councilman Lahullier discussed his concerns with the Borough's overcrowding elementary school resulting from the new developments at the Meadowlands. He believes that Remington and Vernick Engineers should perform a demographic study on all the schools. Furthermore, he believes that the Zoning and Planning Board should take to task the effort to revise the redevelopment plan with Remington and Vernick. Councilman Lahullier, further believes that developers should assist with the schools. However, Councilman Homaychak disagrees, stating that the council is unable to force developers to financially assist with such development. Councilman Brizzi commented that the committee should be more involved with the schools. Additionally, Councilman Brizzi believes that COAH may create restrictions with moving

forward with a redevelopment plan. Stallone, however, suggested offering tax breaks to developers who wants to build construction on the space. Such idea goes along with the idea of creating a redevelopment plan, said Councilman Stallone. Mayor Cassella stated that the only way to address the matter is via redevelopment. The Mayor further commented that property owners have the right to build on their property. However, a feasible plan needs to be put in place to address this concern.

Lastly, Councilman Lahullier submitted the following personnel changes made at the Fire Departments Board of Officers meeting:
