MINUTES OF THE EAST RUTHERFORD MAYOR & COUNCIL WORK MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 18, 2015

POLICE/BUILIDING DEPT/RECYCLING/CIVIC - COUNCILMAN BRIZZI

Councilman Brizzi asked for a correction of the dates on Resolution #114. It should be September 17 and 24.

Councilman Brizzi requested an Executive Session for negotiations and issues with the 312 Grove Street project.

Councilman Brizzi stated that the borough will be holding two additional concerts in September due to the funding that was received. They will be held on September 17th and 24th which will consist of Beatles Faux Sale and The Best. There will be a few DPW workers each night and Chief Minda is rearranging the schedule for the police officers so there will be minimal expenses. He submitted a bill from Cliffhanger Productions in the amount of \$3,750.00 for the cost of the two bands:

Councilman Brizzi discussed a letter that was received from the homeowner of 405-407 Paterson Avenue requesting relocation of the bus stop in front of his property. The Council agrees with the request that the stop be relocated and combined with the current stop on Randolph Avenue which is approximately 50 yards back. A motion was made to make the request with NJ Transit:

Councilman Brizzi questioned Engineer Beckmeyer about replacing the trees after the road program.

Councilman Brizzi stated that he met with Paul DeRosa regarding the recycling issues and we definitely need to enforce more. He submitted Resolution #115 which would authorize Paul DeRosa to write summonses to the repeat offenders:

RESOLUTION NO. 115-2015

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE PUBLIC WORKS COORDINATOR TO ENFORCE ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 248 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD ENTITLED "RECYCLING."

WHEREAS, Article II of Chapter 248 of the Code of the Borough of East Rutherford provides regulations for recycling within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, Section 248-23 provides that the requirements of Article II will be enforced by the Department of Public Works, among others; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council desire to make clear the individual authorized to act in those positions in the enforcement of Chapter 248; and

WHEREAS, Paul DeRosa is the Public Works Coordinator and Acting Supervisor in the Department of Public Works.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford that Paul DeRosa, as Public Works Coordinator Acting Recycling Coordinator and Acting Supervisor of Public Works, is authorized to act on behalf of the Department of Public Works to enforce Article II of Chapter 248 including the issuance of complaints against property owners violating Article II of Chapter 248.

Councilman Brizzi also suggests more education through the schools and the newspapers as well as a bin where people can drop off paper and cardboard.

Councilman Brizzi stated that he is in discussions with the All Access Committee regarding some funding that they may need for mailings, printing, etc.

Councilman Brizzi feels that a Program Director line item should be added to the salary ordinance to make improvements to the program.

Mayor Cassella stated that Paul DeRosa passed the Recycling Coordinator class and made a motion to put him in that position but there will be no increase in pay:

FIRE DEPT/SQUAD – COUNCILMAN LAHULLIER

Councilman Lahullier discussed the idea of giving some commuter relief in the area of Boiling Springs and Main Street around the library.

Councilman Lahullier submitted a requisition for reimbursement to himself in the amount of \$347.11 for his purchases for Rich Speake's fire department retirement.

Councilman Lahullier requested an Executive Session for personnel.

COURT - COUNCILMAN RAVETTINE

Councilman Ravettine asked questions regarding Resolution #114.

Lizz Wilson of Remington, Vernick & Arango was present on behalf of Rick Arango. She gave the following report:

- 1. All items for the Carlton Avenue Fire House Generator will be in place before the start of school except for the generator itself. That will be installed during non-school hours.
- 2. A discussion was held on the DEP Air Permits that need to be filled out for the generators. A responsible party is needed to sign off however the borough is unsure who that should be. Attorney Allen suggested Remington & Vernick give a report verifying all the facts so someone on the borough end can sign off.
- 3. The biannual sampling for the vapor intrusion will take place this month.
- 4. Currently in conversation with Northfolk Southern regarding the railroad.

ENGINEER'S REPORT - GLENN BECKMEYER

Engineer Beckmeyer asked if the borough could pay for the repair and have an agreement with the owners in which a lien is put on the house due to this condition being unsafe. Attorney Allen discussed the borough's liability and is not convinced that we are responsible for fixing the wall. He will look further into the matter and asked that no action be taken at this time.
