Pat McNab (Grove Street) said there is an issue at Grove Street Park. Every night there are kids hanging out there using bad language, staring residents down, drinking, etc. When the police are called the kids run. After discussion there will be more of a police presence in the area.

Victor Fonseca (Carlstadt) owns a home on Jane Street. Has an issue with the lines that were painted on the street. He was never asked to sign the petition and its not fair to the other residents.

Bill Lampman (Jane Street) feels that there is a disgruntled neighbor who has an issue with him taking up two parking spaces. He is not in favor of the lines. He also complained about not being able to obtain a handicapped parking space in front of his home.

Grace Wolfe (Rose Street) asked what other streets were going to be painted with the lines. She also thanked the police officers.

Sergio Segalini (Jane Street) asked why the CCO line item in the budget went up this year as well as the Recreation line item. Questioned why so many people are needed for DPW summer help. Asked if the signatures for the Jane Street petition should be from only homeowners or just residents.

The M&C suggested that the residents who do not want the lines then get a petition stating so.

Antonio Segalini (Jane Street) asked why the meeting tonight is in person. It should also continue as a zoom meeting for those not wanting to attend in person.

Carol McEvily (Jane Street) asked why the petition was not on the agenda

Mrs. Bongiovanni (Rose Street) asked when the seniors could get back into the Civic Center

Orville Drummond (Atkins Terrace) asked if anything could be done about the mosquitos in his yard. They are coming from the Northfork Southern property behind his home. He also asked if residents could register their security cameras with the police to make it easier to find out who has them if there is an issue. He thanked the Mayor and Council for their letter they put on regarding the unrest in the Country.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING PARTICIPATION WITH THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE, DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND PUBLIC SAFETY

WHEREAS, the East Rutherford Police Department wishes to apply for funding of approximately \$60,000.00 with a match of \$15,000.00 for an approximate project total cost of \$75,000.00 for a project under the State of New Jersey Safe and Secure Communities Grant Program (Grant #20-0212) for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council has reviewed the application and has approved said request; and

WHEREAS, the project is a joint effort between the Department of Law and Public Safety and the East Rutherford Police Department for the purpose described in the application;

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**RESOLUTION #72 - 2020**

**RESOLUTION APPROVING DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT FOR HPVIII 33 ROUTE 17, LLC LOCATED AT BLOCK 88 LOTS 1 AND 1.01; and**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of East Rutherford Planning Board approved the application of **HPVIII 33 ROUTE 17, LLC** (the "Developer") for development on property located at Block 88 Lots 1 & 1.01; and

**WHEREAS**, the nature and the extent of the development aforesaid are set forth in Resolution 19-008 of the East Rutherford Planning Board (Planning Board), dated December 9, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, a requirement of that approval is that the Developer enter into a Developer's Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, there has been prepared a Developer's Agreement by and between the Developer and the Borough of East Rutherford (the "Borough") dated June 16, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Attorney, the Borough Engineer and the Planning Board Attorney have reviewed and approved the Developer's Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough desires to authorize the execution of the Developer's Agreement subsequent to its execution by the Developer.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford as follows:

1. All the terms and conditions of a Developer's Agreement dated June 16, 2020 by and between the Borough of East Rutherford and the Developer are hereby approved, ratified and confirmed by the Borough of East Rutherford.
2. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute said Developer's Agreement subsequent to the execution by the Developer and together with other appropriate officers and employees of the Borough are hereby authorized to take all steps necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution,
3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Treatment Works Approval Permit Application if required.
4. The Borough hereby authorizes and approves any modifications to the Developer's Agreement as may be recommended and approved by the Borough Engineer and Borough Attorney prior to execution.
5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Person to Person and Place to Place transfer of the aforesaid Plenary Retail Consumption License will be considered at a later date once all documentation is received and reviewed by the NJ Division of ABC.

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**RESOLUTION #76 - 2020**

**WHEREAS**, the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund (“County Trust Fund”), provides matching grants to municipal governments and to nonprofit organizations for assistance in the development or redevelopment of outdoor municipal recreation facilities; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of East Rutherford desires to further the public interest by obtaining a matching grant of \$450,000.00 from the County Trust Fund to fund the following project: The Borough requests funding to replace the 17-year-old artificial playing surfaces which are utilized by the high school and recreation softball and soccer programs, as well as summer recreation camps. Additional work includes: resurface, level, and repost three tennis courts; resurface basketball court; add canvas shade structure near concession/bathrooms for summer camp use; repair paved walkways; repair fencing; install higher netting around softball field to protect residential properties; reline parking area; and repair playground equipment, all within ADA compliance; and,

**WHEREAS**, the governing body/board has reviewed the County Trust Fund Program Statement, and the Trust Fund Municipal Program Park Improvement application and instructions, and desires to make an application for such a matching grant and provide application information and furnish such documents as may be required; and,

**WHEREAS**, as part of the application process, the governing body/board received held the required Public Hearing to receive public comments on the proposed park improvements in the application on June 16, 2020; and,

**WHEREAS**, the County of Bergen shall determine whether the application is complete and in conformance with the scope and intent of the County Trust Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the applicant is willing to use the County Trust Fund in accordance with such rules, regulations and applicable statutes, and is willing to enter into an agreement with the County of Bergen for the above named project and ensure its completion on or about the project contract expiration date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the **Borough of East Rutherford**:

1. That it is hereby authorized to submit the above completed project application to the County by the deadline of as established by the County; and,
2. That, in the event of a County Trust Fund award that may be less than the grant amount requested above, the **Borough of East Rutherford** has, or will secure, the balance of funding necessary to complete the project, or modify the project as necessary; and,
3. That the **Borough of East Rutherford** is committed to providing a dollar for dollar cash match for the project; and,
4. That only those park improvements identified and approved in the project application, its Trust Fund contract, or other documentation will be considered eligible for reimbursement.
5. That the **Borough of East Rutherford** agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations in its performance of the project; and,
6. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the Municipality of East Rutherford and its residents to participate in said Programs.

**WHEREAS**, certain Federal funds are potentially available to the County of Bergen under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; the HOME Investment Partnership Act of 1990, as amended; and the Emergency Solutions Grant of 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to supersede an existing Interlocal Services Cooperative Agreement for the County and its people to benefit from these Programs; and

**WHEREAS**, an Agreement has been proposed under which the Municipality of East Rutherford and the County of Bergen in cooperation with other Municipalities, will modify an Interlocal Services Program pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the Municipality of East Rutherford to enter into such an Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Municipality of East Rutherford that the Agreement entitled “Three Year Cooperative Agreement” (an Agreement superseding the Cooperative Agreement dated July 1, 2000 – June 30, 2003) to clarify the planning and implementation procedures and to enable the Municipality to make a Three Year irrevocable commitment to participate in the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), the Home Investment Partnership Program (HOME), and the Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG) for the Program Years 2021, 2022, and 2023 covering the period July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2024 be executed by the Mayor and Municipal Clerk in accordance with the provisions of law; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this resolution shall take effect immediately in accordance with law and that an original copy be made available to the Director of the Bergen County Division of Community Development as soon as possible and no later than Friday, July 17, 2020.

**RESOLUTION to JOIN**

**WHEREAS**, a number of public entities in the State of New Jersey have joined together to form the **Bergen Municipal Employee Benefits Fund**, hereafter referred to as "FUND", as permitted by N.J.S.A. 11:15-3, 17:1-8.1, and 40A:10-36 et seq., and;

**WHEREAS**, the FUND was approved to become operational by the Departments of Insurance and Community Affairs and has been operational since that date, and;

**WHEREAS**, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a joint insurance fund, contain certain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a FUND;

**WHEREAS**, the governing body of East Rutherford hereinafter referred to as "LOCAL UNIT" has determined that membership in the FUND is in the best interest of the LOCAL UNIT.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the governing body of the LOCAL UNIT hereby agrees as follows:

- i. Become a member of the FUND for the period outlined in the LOCAL UNIT's Indemnity and Trust Agreements.
- ii. Will participate in the following type (s) of coverage (s):
  - a.) Dental Insurance as defined pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17B:17-4, the FUND's Bylaws, and Plan of Risk Management.
- iii. Adopts and approves the FUND's Bylaws.
- iv. Execute an application for membership and any accompanying certifications.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the governing body of the LOCAL UNIT is authorized and directed to execute the Indemnity and Trust Agreement and such other documents signifying membership in the FUND as required by the FUND's Bylaws, and to deliver these documents to the FUND's Executive Director with the express reservation that these documents shall become effective only upon:

- i. Approval of the LOCAL UNIT by the FUND.
- ii. Receipt from the LOCAL UNIT of a Resolution accepting assessment.
- iii. Approval by the New Jersey Department of Insurance and Department of Community Affairs.

**WHEREAS**, the list is as complete as it can be at this time and any additional vendors who sign on after the date of this resolution must be submitted to the Municipality to be confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the Mayor and Council even if said meeting is subsequent to the commencement of the event; and

**WHEREAS**, the location of the amusement games to be operated by said vendors listed on Exhibit A (attached hereto and made a part hereof) is located on Route 3 in East Rutherford, New Jersey ; and

**WHEREAS**, amusement games are being held pursuant to all the applicable rules and regulations of the Department of Law and Public Safety, Office of Amusement Games Control; and

**WHEREAS**, under the requirements of the Department of Law and Public Safety, all owners of these games must have undergone a police criminal history background check to which the operators of the State Fair Meadowlands have taken complete responsibility, and shall submit the background check to the appropriate state agencies and to the Municipality upon receipt of the same; and

**WHEREAS**, under said regulation the issuance of licenses for amusement games must be authorized by a resolution duly adopted by the Municipal Governing Body; and

**WHEREAS**, the State Office of Amusement Games Control requires the Governing Body of the Borough of East Rutherford to authorize the issuance of such licenses at an approved site;

**NOW, THEREFORE** be it resolved by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford as follows:

1. That the Borough Council of the Borough of East Rutherford hereby approve the vendors listed on Exhibit A (attached hereto and made a part hereof), to operate amusement games on the premises of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, Route 3 in East Rutherford, New Jersey by State Fair Event Management.
2. That said approval is subject to the specific approval of each amusement game by the New Jersey Office of Amusement Games Control, and compliance with all State, County and all local regulations pertaining hereto.



3. That the fee to be charged for each individual license to be issued will be one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars per game, per event, and that the period of time for the issuance of said license shall be January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Amusement Games Control Commission.

**RESOLUTION #74 - 2020**

**RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD DENOUNCING ALL ACTS OF RACIAL INJUSTICE AND RACIAL VIOLENCE, THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, AND CALLING FOR COMMUNITY DIALOGUE, UNITY AND HEALING**

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the Borough of East Rutherford is deeply saddened and troubled by the recent senseless events resulting in the tragic death of George Floyd; and

**WHEREAS**, racial bias crimes across the United States have risen significantly since 2016; and this was not an isolated incident; and

**WHEREAS**, citizens across our nation are rightfully angry, scared and outraged by the continued acts of racial bias and have taken to the streets in protest; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford wish to condemn all acts of racial bias and strive to ensure that all members of our community are safe, protected, respected, and served by their public servants; no matter their race or ethnicity; and desire to foster a community free of bias, fear, intimidation, and violence – a community in which people are not targeted or hurt unnecessarily – and provide equal protection under the law regardless of color or creed; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford hereby:

1. Denounces all forms of racial injustice, bias and violence, including police violence, and calls for an end to the use of excessive force and militarized policing practices in the United States;
2. Demands that all bias crimes, including those perpetrated by law enforcement, are properly investigated and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law;
3. Honors and thanks those police and other law enforcement personnel who put their lives on the line daily while lawfully serving to protect the welfare of our communities and looks forward to continuing to work in partnership with our local police department to pursue our shared goal of equal protection under the law;
4. Stands in solidarity with peaceful protesters, condemns violent protests, and calls on law enforcement agencies throughout the country to protect the civil rights of peaceful protesters and indeed to join with them in their effort to combat systemic racism;
5. Reaffirms the commitment of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford to equality and pledges to work together with community leaders to expand the

partnership between government, law enforcement and citizens and encourages dialogue about how true equity, unity, and healing can be achieved; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this Resolution is forwarded to the Borough Assembly Representatives Gary Schaer Clinton Calabese, State Senator Paul Sarlo, Senate President Stephen M. Sweeney, Assembly Speaker, the Lieutenant Governor, the Governor of State of New Jersey and the League of Municipalities.

  - On Thursday June 11<sup>th</sup> a “Carlstadt-East Rutherford BLM Peaceful Protest” was held. The protest began in Carlstadt with participants walking a designated route, pausing at Carlstadt Borough Hall for speeches before continuing into East Rutherford concluding at East Rutherford Borough Hall for speeches. The ERPD was tasked with controlling traffic at a total of 19 traffic posts as well as providing a safe escort and secure area around Borough Hall, Borough Hall Park and Alfred S. Faust Intermediate School. Through extensive planning and collaboration with our public safety partners and surrounding agencies the event concluded without incident.
