RESOLUTION NO. 72 – 2021

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (US EPA) proposed plan for the upper 9 miles of the Lower Passaic River, also known as the Diamond Alkali Superfund Site Operable Unit 4 was released on April 14, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the US EPA and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) have worked collaboratively over the past three (3) years plus to create a plan for the upper 9 miles of the Passaic River. We are pleased to see that the proposed plan will fast track remediation of contaminated sediment in the upper 9 miles of the Passaic River, thereby cutting approximately even (7) years from the traditional cleanup schedule. Through this action both the US EPA and NJDEP have shown that they have taken very seriously the comments received during the Lower 8-Mile public comment period; and

WHEREAS, the original schedule called for performing the Lower 8-mile Remedy first, followed by the Upper 9 miles of the Passaic River. That approach did not appeal to the Borough of East Rutherford given the large scope of the Lower 8-mile removal in a tidal river like the Passaic River and the was not fair to the stakeholders in the Upper 9 miles of the Passaic River; and

WHEREAS, the US EPA's Proposed Plan aligns the Lower 8 with the Upper 9 removals, thereby permitting project managers to monitor and manage any resuspension and transportation of contaminated sediments from the Lower 8-mile project into the upper 9 mile area and visa versa; and

WHEREAS, while the US EPA's Proposed Plan is subject to public comment before a Record of Decision (ROD) is issued, all indications are that vast majority of the work will take place in the river, thus indicating approximately 387,000 cubic yards of contaminated sediment will be removed from the Upper 9 mile area via barge to a treatment facility down river, not via truck through the communities along the Passaic River; and

WHEREAS, the USEPA and NJDEP have heard from the communities along the Passaic River, that flooding remains a serious concern, and we are happy to see that the proposed plan for the Upper 9 mile project will not adversely impact flooding in the region; and

WHEREAS, environmental justice remains a priority of the Borough of East Rutherford. This plan demonstrated that Governor Murphy, the Passaic River Community Advisory Group (CAG), the US EPA, and the NJDEP all share in that commitment. The completion of this project will significantly address environmental justice concerns in the region and is a positive step forward for these communities.

WHEREAS, cleaning of the Passaic River will certainty lead to enhanced economic development for the Borough of East Rutherford along the waterfront;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford, Bergen County, State of New Jersey, hereby endorse the US EPA's Proposed Plan for the Upper 9 miles clean-up project of the upper 9 miles of the Lower Passaic River, also known as the Diamond Alkali Superfund Site Operable Unit 4; and
- 2. The Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford directs the Borough Clerk to forward a copy of this resolution to the US EPA, US Senator Cory Booker, US Senator Bob Menendez, Congressman Bill

Pascrell, Governor Phil Murphy, NJ DEP Commissioner Shawn LaTourette, District 34 Legislators, Upper 9 Mayors and the Passaic River Community Advisory Group (CAG); and

3. The Mayor and Council also urge the US EPA and NJDEP, while designing and implementing this project, the agencies focus on the erosion that has occurred along the shorelines of East Rutherford and continues during major storm surge events. Anything that can be done to project our shoreline would be a benefit to East Rutherford.

RESOLUTION #73 – 2021

At a Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, held on May 18, 2021.

Resolution #74 - 2021

WHEREAS, the East Rutherford CFO in consultation with the Tax Collector has calculated an estimated tax levy in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3 and they have both signed a certification show the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted estimated tax levies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Borough of East Rutherford the following:

- 1. The East Rutherford Borough Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue tax bills for the Borough for the third installment of 2021 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed after passage of this resolution and take such actions as are permitted and required by P.L. 1994, c. 72 (N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54:4-66.3).
- 2. The entire estimated tax levy for 2021 is hereby set at \$42,283,150.68.
- 3. In accordance with law the third installment of 2021 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10th or the 25th calendar day after the date estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.

RESOLUTION #75 - 2021

RESOLUTION DIRECTING AND AUTHORIZING THE EAST RUTHERFORD PLANNING BOARD TO UNDERTAKE A PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE PROPOSED STUDY AREA, WHICH INCLUDES LOT 5 IN BLOCK 97 and LOT 1 IN BLOCK 98 AS SHOWN ON THE BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD TAX MAP, QUALIFIES AS A NON-CONDEMNATION AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq.* provides a mechanism to empower and assist local governments in efforts to promote programs of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law sets forth a specific procedure for establishing an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-6, prior to the governing body making a determination as to whether a particular study area qualifies as an area in need of redevelopment, the governing body must authorize the Borough Planning Board, by Resolution, to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether the area meets the criteria of a non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment as set forth in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of East Rutherford wishes to direct the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether Lot 5 in Block 97 and Lot 1 in Block 98, as shown on Borough of East Rutherford Tax Map (the "Proposed Study Area"), qualifies as an area in need of redevelopment pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5; and

WHEREAS, this study is being undertaken at the request of Vango 263 Hackensack Street LLC and the Borough of East Rutherford; and

WHEREAS, and the Borough of East Rutherford and Vango 263 Hackensack Street LLC will enter into an Escrow Agreement with Vango 263 Hackensack Street LLC to be responsible for all expenses and professional fees incurred by the Borough and the Planning Board in conjunction with the request.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford that the Borough of East Rutherford Planning Board is hereby directed to conduct the necessary preliminary investigation, including the holding of a public hearing, to determine whether to recommend that the Proposed Study Area, should be designated as a non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment under the criteria set forth in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq*.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Board shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Mayor and Council in the form of a Resolution with supporting documentation.

RESOLUTION NO. 76 – 2021 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST RUTHERFORD, COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY DESIGNATING LOT 8 IN BLOCK 52 AS AN "AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT"

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of East Rutherford by Resolution #119-2019 adopted August 20, 2019 authorized the Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine if an area identified as Block 52 Lot 8, (the "Subject Area") constitutes an "area in need of redevelopment" as defined under the New Jersey Local Redevelopment Housing Law ("LRHL"); and

WHEREAS, the Subject Area which consists of approximately 0.74-acres and has a street address of 315 Railroad Avenue, is located in the central portion of the Borough adjacent to the Erie Lackawanna railroad right-of-way and the Borough's municipal boundary with the Borough of Rutherford; and

WHEREAS, in order to undertake this task, the Borough retained Phillips Preiss Grygiel Leheny Hughes LLC to assist the Planning Board in this effort by commencing an investigation and preparing a report for the Planning Board's review within the context of "non condemnation" redevelopment procedure; and

WHEREAS, Richard Preiss, Professional Planner, prepared a report entitled, "Area In Need of Redevelopment Study: Block 52, Lot 8 dated February 2020", which included a map of the study area and an overall analysis of whether the property qualifies as an area in need of redevelopment. The study was circulated and presented to the East Rutherford Planning Board for consideration; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board established a hearing date for its consideration of the preliminary investigation and provided notice in accordance with the LRHL and its intended meeting for the purposes of hearing persons who would be affected by a determination that the delineated area is an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board held its hearing on May 17, 2021 at which time it was established that notice under the LRHL was properly provided, published and served in accordance with the LRHL; and

WHEREAS, at the public hearing, the Board accorded to all members of the public the opportunity to offer their comments respecting the study area and which comments were made as part of the public record; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Consultant, Paul Grygiel of Phillips Preiss Grygiel Leheny Hughes LLC, presented his report and summarized such findings as well as testifying in depth regarding an analysis of the Subject Area for consideration as an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the East Rutherford Planning Board, by way of resolution adopted on May 17, 2021 memorialized the findings of the Planning Board which recommended to the Mayor and Council in accordance with the LRHL that it designate the Subject Property as "an area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council received the resolution of the Planning Board dated May 17, 2021 and the recommendations contained therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford, in the County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. Based on the facts and findings of the report prepared by Phillips Preiss Grygiel Leheny Hughes LLC entitled "Area In Need of Redevelopment Study: Block 52, Lot 8 dated February, 2020" and the findings of the Planning Board, all made in accordance with NJSA 40A:12A-1 et seq., that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Rutherford does hereby declare the following parcel of land, known and described on the Tax Map of the Borough of East Rutherford, to be an "area in need of redevelopment": Block 52, Lot 8.
- 2. The Borough of East Rutherford intends to utilize the authority provided by the Legislature for use in a redevelopment area, without the power of eminent domain, with respect to the above designated property.
- 3. The Borough Clerk shall serve by certified mail, return receipt requested, a copy of this resolution upon the owners of the above-mentioned lot as well as any person who filed a written objection thereto and stated, in or upon the written submission, at an address to which notice of determination may be sent.
- 4. The Borough Planner has been authorized and has prepared a redevelopment plan for the property designated by this resolution as an "area in need of redevelopment," for review and adoption by this governing body.
- 5. A Copy of this Resolution and the AINR Study shall be forwarded to the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs by the Borough Clerk upon adoption.

- On April 3rd Officers assisted with traffic control and security during the distribution of Easter Baskets in the public parking lot of Police Headquarters. Officers then assisted the ERFD escorting the Easter Bunny throughout the Borough.
- On April 3rd Officers were requested by Carlstadt Police to provide mutual aid at the scene of a barricaded suspect. Officers responded and provided assistance for the duration of the incident.
- On May 6th Dispatch received a report of an injured employee at a chemical company within the borough. Upon officers arrival they were directed to an employee with apparent burns and swelling of the face experiencing respiratory distress due to being splashed with an unknown chemical. EMS, ALS, and ERFD were dispatched to render aid and ensure the warehouse area was safe. Officers donned PPE, began to render aid, secured the area and worked to determine what the chemical substance was. ALS responders assessed the injuries and requested a medivac helicopter be dispatched to airlift the patient to St. Barnabas Medical Center for treatment. Officers escorted EMS and ALS from the scene to the NJSEA helipad near Met Life Stadium to facilitate the medivac. Bergen County HazMat, NJDEP, and OSHA were requested and responded for investigation.
- On May 13th, at approximately 6:02 PM ERPD Dispatch received several calls reporting a serious MVC Rt 3 Eastbound at the South Service Road exit. Upon arrival officers found two vehicles traveling east on Rt 3 collided causing one vehicle to leave the roadway striking a light pole. Fire and EMS responded and extricated two victims from that vehicle. The driver sustained skull and facial fractures while the passenger sustained a fractured leg that required surgery and numerous lacerations. The driver of the other vehicle sustained apparent minor injuries to their neck and lower back. The Bergen County Prosecutor's Office Fatal Team, Bergen County Sheriff's Department BCI assisted with the investigation. NJDOT assisted with traffic control. Two lanes of Rt 3 Eastbound and the ramp to the South Service Road remained closed for 6 hours to facilitate further investigation. The joint investigation remains ongoing and no charges have been filed at this time.
